Also, earlier in January the Club hosted the 2014 Australian Made Foundation Cup for young players from Australian state regional teams. This was a successful event and well supported by the Club.

If you cast your minds back, you will note we had some very challenging weather during this period. I commend Bill Turner and our grounds staff who maintained the courts and grounds in top condition through this period, as well as for our championships in

February. Congratulations to our winners of the Senior and Junior Championship events – details on page 13.

The Club fielded a ladies team in the Asia-Pacific Tennis League (ATL) for the first time, and we were lucky enough to be the winners at our first attempt. We won the Victorian conference in November and the overall ATL challenge in the second week of the Australian Open at Melbourne Park. Team member Storm Sanders was subsequently selected in the team to play in the Australian Federation Cup against Russia and Germany. Whilst many of our team players will be away playing tournaments during the year, we hope to see them back at the Club from time to time practicing or engaged in other Club activities details on page 6.

Since the last Centrecourt magazine, we have renewed our coaching contract with SMARTennis. This is a re-invigorated arrangement with more emphasis in many areas, particularly with Juniors, including Hot Shots, and organising touring groups to Victorian country tournaments. Smartennis and RSY's interests are now more closely aligned in all tennis matters, and we look forward to advancing this relationship.

The Club also organised many Christmas and end of year 'wind up' events for various groups, including our Christmas Dinner. It was great to see so many members celebrating.

I am pleased that we have added The New Haven Lawn Club in Connecticut and The Sloane Club in London to our suite of reciprocal clubs. We will continue to investigate other clubs and arrangements to add to this list for members enjoyment. We have already hosted the very successful autumn 130th Anniversary Cocktail Party but still have some exciting events planned for the next few months. There will be an introduction of the Captain's Trophy for tennis players, Anzac Lunch, Winemakers Lunch, Electric Light Tournament for our Young Members Group, Pennant Tennis & Squash Get-Together, Art Show and Trivia Night. I hope members enjoy these, and the many other events being organised.

The Committee wishes to keep you well informed of all events, opportunities and sports results. We will utilise our website as a key platform to keep you informed plus provide Club and tennis related resources. In addition we will use other media (Emails, Facebook, etc., including the 'President's Pen') to advise you of upcoming events and news.

We are mindful that members don't want to be overburdened by our communications, and aim to strike the right balance. Whilst I'm sure everyone will have differing views on communications, we would appreciate your feedback.

In conclusion, I look forward to catching up with many of you at the Club over the coming months.

This ATL competition is now in its second year and momentum is building, already there is talk of a junior competition next year. This competition is positioned for seasoned tournament players making their way up into the circuit, plus those returning home who have been travelling the world circuits.

The initial home and away rounds were played in Melbourne where the RSY Royals defeated the Kooyong Classics by three games in the Victorian grand final, a very exciting finish for the local derby! The tie break was off to a quick start with the Royals quickly stretching out to a 5-1 lead.

The trophy was within our grasp and we edged further forward leading 8-3 until the Flagstaff Freighters fought back to level the scores at

9-9. Club members were on their feet cheering on our women in this strongly contested battle. The strength of the RSY Royals serve was too strong, taking the next two points and the championship.

Coaching Tip



Is a Tennis ball just a Tennis ball?

The answer to a tennis player to the above question is definitely NO!!

There are many brands of tennis balls

on the market, but if you take a closer look there are also several different types of tennis ball including clay court/hard court balls or the traditional grass court ball.

"Why is there a need for different types of tennis balls?" The answer is "because court surfaces, as well as playing conditions vary."

Clay court balls obviously should be used on clay.

They are slightly heavier than a grass court ball and the nap or felt on the outer layer is designed to last on the coarse clay. The extra weight allows the ball to push through the slight imperfections of the clay a little easier than a grass court ball, therefore reducing the chance of bad bounces.

Grass court balls are made specifically for use on grass.

Grass court balls are slightly lighter than hard court balls and the nap is slightly tighter to make them faster and less prone to 'fluffing' or absorb as much moisture from the grass as would a hard court ball. This is very important, as executing a volley on grass with a dead, heavy, moist ball with a large amount of nap, reduces the traditional advantage of a good net player.

It is disappointing that the traditional serve and volley players are being forced out of the game, not only by racquet and string technology, but also by a bias towards heavy and slow tennis balls, which incidentally, assist baseline play.

Hard court balls are traditionally heavier than grass court balls.

Interestingly, hard court balls from the United States are a lot lighter and faster through the air than their typical Australian counterpart; the Slazenger hard court ball. However, both balls seem to perform well on hard courts.

How long do tennis balls last?

Tennis balls used for practice should last for up to three to four hours of hitting, rotating 2-4 balls from new. Playing a match is slightly different; it should be that a pair of new balls are used for a maximum of two sets plus a new pair for the third set.

For pennant tennis you can use new balls every set, which I believe is the far better option. To use new balls for only the third set would see a marked difference of the play, using a combination of old and new balls. This is why the professionals change balls after only seven games and then thereafter for every nine games, so as the adjustment to play is minimised. Even then most professionals will implement a fresh racquet re-string to compensate for the new balls.

In the interests of having a good game the next time you choose tennis balls, please consider the court surface, the game style and the ball's use-by-date, as this will significantly enhance your enjoyment of this great sport.
